We have applied for permission for members of Moss Vale Probus to visit HMAS Albatross (Nowra) on Monday, 12th August 2019. HMAS Albatross is the home of the Royal Australian Navy's Fleet Air Arm and its four operational flying squadrons. It is also the location of the Fleet Air Arm Museum.

The yet to be approved programme for the day may include

- A windscreen tour of the Base from the bus.
- A visit to 723 Sqn and a look over an EC135 helicopter.
- A visit to the HATS Flight Simulator.
- A visit to 816 Sqn and a look over a Seahawk helicopter.
- A visit to the Seahawk Flight Simulator.
- A visit to 808 Sqn and a look over a MRH-90 helicopter
- A visit to the HMAS Albatross control tower.
- A visit to the Fleet Air Arm Museum.
