### **KANGAROO VALLEY HYDRO SYSTEM**

The visit to the Kangaroo Valley Hydro Scheme will take place on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May. Participants are asked to meet at the Botanic Gardens car park at 8:30am sharp so carpooling can be organised for the trip. The actual tour will start at 9:30am.

Note that the minimum clothing (PPE) requirements for site access are long sleeved shirt (high visibility preferred ie light coloured), long trousers and enclosed footwear (steel cap boots preferred but not essential). Anyone with a hard hat or safety glasses, please bring them on the day, if not they will be provided. There is no charge but lunch will be at one of the local venues at your own cost. There is still room for a couple more members to attend but you will have to get your names to Gordon. **Bookings close at the May general meeting 10<sup>th</sup> May.**

### **FAIRGROUND FOLLIES**

### **HMAS ALBATROSS (Nowra)**

We have applied for permission for members of Moss Vale Probus to visit HMAS Albatross (Nowra) on Monday, 12<sup>th</sup> August 2019. HMAS Albatross is the home of the Royal Australian Navy's Fleet Air Arm and its four operational flying squadrons. It is also the location of the Fleet Air Arm Museum.

The programme may include a bus tour of the base, a visit to 723 Sqn, 808 Sqn and 816 Sqn, inspection of an EC135 helicopter, an MRH 90 helicopter and a Seahawk helicopter, visits to HATS

flight simulator and Seahawk flight simulator, a visit to the HMAS Albatross control tower and the Fleet Air Arm Museum.

The tour will be followed by lunch at HMAS Albatross in the canteen where light meals and drinks can be purchased. Transport will be by private car and car pooling is encouraged for the day. Further information as it comes to hand.
